



How To Dress For An Interview

An interview is not the place to show off your personal sense of style. You want the interviewer to remember you, not your clothes. You will be examined head to toe in an interview. Make sure your appearance puts your best foot forward!

For men and women:

- Conservative, dark two piece suit
- well-groomed hair
- neat, trimmed fingernails
- minimal fragrances. These can cause allergic reactions, including aftershave and cigarettes
- no gum or candy
- no visible body piercing or tattoos
- check for frays or missing buttons
- no bulging or jingling pockets
- shoes need to be shined or cleaned, no dull, old shoes

Men:

- conservative tie
- dark dress socks
- dark, conservative dress shoes
- fresh, or neatly maintained facial hair
- no jewelry other than wedding or college ring
- no solid black suits, these are usually considered too formal

Women:

- suit with slacks or skirts, or a dress with a coordinating jacket
- conservative heels
- hosiery near skin color, no runs
- neutral or clear nail polish
- simple makeup, include a neutral lipstick or gloss
